Whilst we have been in lockdown, the Rose Bowl Awards Committee has been discussing what is best for the Awards 2019/2020 Season and we wanted to give you an update.

# Our plans for this season

Before the theatres went dark, 43 productions had been adjudicated and reports sent out to the clubs who had entered. Unfortunately we then had the news of the lockdown. We recognise all the efforts that clubs throughout the South West have put in, rehearsals attended, costumes made, sets built and the hard decisions that have had to be made. We understand that in most cases, productions have been postponed but unfortunately a few have had to be totally cancelled due to Licences not being available for next year. We are so sorry for those who will not be able to see their hard work through to fruition.

We would like you to be assured that any adjudication fees paid for a production that has been cancelled can either be refunded or can be carried forward. Where an Adjudicator had already been assigned to a particular production, that Adjudicator will be given the re-scheduled dates first to see if they can still attend and, if this is not possible, an alternative will be arranged.



With all that has happened and with uncertainties about when theatres will reopen, the Committee has made the decision to extend this season through to August 2021. This means that any nominations that are made from the 43 productions so far this season will be carried forward until next year. As we don't know when performances will be allowed to begin again it seems the right thing to do. We hope you agree.



# Now some good news

While we have all been in lockdown, we have heard about so many Clubs and Societies doing their bit to keep their groups going, from online rehearsals, play readings, singing together and virtual performances. It is so lovely to know that communities are still working together and achieving creative results to keep our spirits up. This being so, we would like to announce a special and one off Award (to be presented in the extended 2019/2021 Season only) The Lockdown Award, for 'virtual activity' during the lockdown. This gives all of our Clubs and Societies the opportunity to show us what you've been up to, whether that is individual performances, virtual rehearsals, promotional activity for future shows, or footage of a show that has had to be shelved for the time being.

Your entry should be a 3 minute (max) video, showing what you have been doing during these unprecedented times. You can send it as a YouTube film, a recorded Zoom piece, or simply a film that you've made on your phone. I hope that you enjoy making these and I am sure that they will prove interesting recollections of 2020 that we won't ever forget.
